LADONIA DRUG DEALER SENTENCED TO 10 YEARS IN PRISON

(Bonham, Texas—July 12, 2016) Shannon Renae King, 33, of Ladonia, Texas, was sentenced yesterday to serve ten years in prison for two felony drug delivery charges. King, and her boyfriend Marcus Earl Aubrey, were arrested in September 2015 for selling crack cocaine, methamphetamine, and marijuana out of their home located at 701 West Main Street in Ladonia. The house was considered to be in a drug-free zone as it was located next door to Fannindel High School. A police search of the King/Aubrey residence resulted in the recovery of dealer amounts of all three illegal substances, along with cash, packaging materials and an RTF detector used to detect recording devices.



Aubrey, who was already on probation for selling marijuana, pleaded guilty to three felony drug charges in March and received twenty years for his participation in the illegal drug enterprise. Don Hoover, the prosecutor on both cases, stated, "The Criminal Investigation Division of the Fannin County Sheriff's Office should be given full credit for its outstanding and important investigation that led to the convictions of these two drug dealers. Ladonia is a safer place now that Ms. King and Mr. Aubrey have been removed from the community."
