## 336<sup>th</sup> District Court Felony Dispositions for August, 2016

Richard Glaser, Criminal District Attorney, released a list of people who entered into plea agreements with his office during the August dockets before Judge Laurine Blake of the 336<sup>th</sup> District Court of Fannin County. The following individuals either entered guilty pleas and accepted responsibility for their conduct without further court action or their cases went to trial and a Fannin County Jury rendered the verdict and sentence indicated. For the month of August, there were 22 new felony cases indicted and 16 felony cases resolved—one of which was a jury trial lasting a full week.

**Timothy Leon Lueck, 49, of Paris** – pleaded not guilty to the 2nd Degree Felony Offense of **AGGRAVATED ASSAULT W/DEADLY WEAPON – ENHANCED.** Lueck and was <u>FOUND GUILTY BY A JURY</u> and that same Jury rendered a sentence of 99 years incarceration in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice – Institutional Division, and he was assessed \$374 court costs.

**Chad Nathan Brown, 30, of Whitewright** - pleaded guilty to the *lesser included* Class A Misdemeanor offense of **FALSE ALARM OR REPORT.** Brown was placed on Deferred Adjudication Community Supervision for a period of 2 years and his \$269 court costs were probated by community service.

**FAMILY/HOUSEHOLD MEMBER W/PREVIOUS CONVICTION** — **ENHANCED**. Dunlap was convicted and sentenced to serve a term of 10 years incarceration in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice — Institutional Division and assessed a \$1,000 fine and \$354 court costs. After sentencing Dunlap, the court suspended his sentence and placed him on community supervision for a period of 10 years.

**Lafayette Damont Dunlap, 28, of Bonham** - pleaded guilty to *two lesser included* Class A Misdemeanor offenses of **ASSAULT CAUSES BODILY INJURY**. Dunlap was convicted and sentenced to serve a term of 180 days incarceration in the County Jail in each case and assessed \$558 court costs.

Joe Harris, 31, of Boswell, OK - pleaded guilty to the 2nd Degree Felony offense of POSS (POSSESSION) CS (CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE) PG (PENALTY GROUP) 1 >=4G (GREATER OR EQUAL TO FOUR GRAMS) <200G (LESS THAN 200 GRAMS) – ENHANCED. Harris was convicted and sentenced to serve a term of 10 years incarceration on the Institutional Division – Texas Department of Criminal Justice and assessed \$314 court costs and \$180 restitution.

**Kurry Norman Franklin James, 40, of Savoy** - pleaded guilty to the *lesser included* State Jail Felony offense of **MAN DEL CS PG 1 <1G - ENHANCED**. James was convicted and sentenced to serve a term of 5 years incarceration in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice – Institutional Division and assessed \$379 court costs and \$180 restitution.

**Phillip Edward Judd, 50, of Telephone** - pleaded guilty to the 3rd Degree Felony offense of **DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED/OPEN ALCOHOL CONTAINER 3<sup>RD</sup>/MORE – ENHANCED.** Judd was convicted and sentenced to a term of 8 years incarceration in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice – Institutional Division, and assessed \$314 court costs and \$100 restitution.

Anthony Ryan May, 24, of Bonham - pleaded guilty to the State Jail Felony offense of POSS CS PG 1 <1G. May was convicted and sentenced to a term of 2 years incarceration in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice — State Jail Division and assessed \$374 court costs and \$180 restitution. After sentencing May, the court suspended his sentence and placed him on community supervision for a period of 5 years.

**Anthony Ryan May, 24, of Bonham -** pleaded guilty to *two* 3rd Degree Felony offenses of **UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OF FIREARM BY FELON.** May was convicted and sentenced to a term of 10 years incarceration in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice – Institutional Division, assessed a \$1,500 fine and \$678 court costs. After sentencing May, the court suspended his sentence and placed him on community supervision for a period of 10 years in each case.

Casey Wayne Moore, 35, of Savoy - pleaded true to the allegations contained in the State's Motion Revoking Community Supervision. Moore was convicted and sentenced to serve a term of 2 years incarceration in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice – State Jail Division and assessed a \$1,395 fine and \$233 court costs for the State Jail Felony offense of THEFT OF FIREARM committed on or about August 7, 2013.

**Jodie Brandon Nichols, 38, of Bonham** - pleaded guilty to the 3rd Degree Felony offense of **ASSAULT FAMILY/HOUSE MEMBER IMPEDE BREATH/CIRCULATION** — **ENHANCED.** Nichols was placed on Deferred Adjudication Community Supervision for a period of 10 years and assessed a \$1,000 fine and \$304 court costs.

Jeffery Weylin Roys, 41, of Van Alstyne - pleaded guilty to the 3rd Degree Felony offense of DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED 3rd OR MORE — ENHANCED. Roys was convicted and sentenced to a term of 8 years incarceration in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice — Institutional Division, and assessed \$314 court costs and \$100 restitution.

**Diana Marie Sabatine, 52, of Ft. Worth** - pleaded guilty to the *lesser included* Class A Misdemeanor offense of **HINDER PROCEEDINGS BY DISORDERLY CONDUCT**. Sabatine was convicted and sentenced to serve a term of 5 days incarceration in the County Jail and assessed \$319 court costs.

Regina Faye Shreves, 55, of Bonham - pleaded guilty to the State Jail Felony offense of POSSESSION MARIJUANA >40Z<=5LBS. Shreves was placed on Deferred Adjudication Community Supervision for a period of 5 years and assessed a \$2,000 fine and \$329 court costs. Shreves was referred to the Fannin County Drug Court program of intense but personalized supervision.
